The Dutch Electronic Art Festival (DEAF), which will take place between the 16th and 20th May in Amsterdam and Rotterdam, has always been characterized as being an interdisciplinary festival in which architecture plays an important role. Here are three tips for architects and visitors to the IABR for gaining a new interdisciplinary perspective on their field.

1. Exhibition The Power of Things

May 17 / m 3 June 2012

The central exhibition of the DEAF2012 festival takes place in the former Bremer post office on the Coolsingel in Rotterdam. The central work is the *Notion Motion* installation by Olafur Eliasson, the Danish-Icelandic artist is best known for his landscape-like installations which he constructs using relatively simple technical means to simulate natural phenomena.

Also included in the exhibition is an installation from the *Hylozoic Series* by Canadian architect Philip Beesley, also renowned for his architectural spaces. In *Hylozoic Series* presents Beesley's spatial installations, entirely composed of small, fragile elements and projections that create an environment that breathes and moves around the audience.
